First a **NEED**: someone to do the pick up donated food from the Wegmans on the Carlise Pike, and deliver the food to our house where I store the food. Pick up is anywhere between 730 till 8:30 am. Roman and Jim weigh the food and place it on a skid. To run this ministry there are many people that help make it work that are "behind the scenes." Helping Hands Ministries consists of many hands to help many people. First and foremost this is Gods ministry and 2nd my husband is the backbone. He deals with all the food that is picked-up, needs stored and taken to soup kitchen. Third the people who help do some the pick-ups Paul, Roman, Jim, and Gary. At St. Michael Lutheran Church where we serve, we have hosts to open the door and make sure we have a great place to serve indoors. On Saturdays I pick up a couple guys from Daystar, a Christian recovery house, to help pick up donations from the Broad Street Market. There are times where I am unable to do soup kitchen and need someone "in charge" - Bob; and someone to heat up the food that has been prepared by Hilton., "spaghetti Friday" Charlton UMC, casseroles provided by a small group from St. Johns Lutheran—my husband; and someone to make a meal—Jill. When my husband cannot be here to load the vehicles and take the second vehicle downtown either my step-son Terry or my neighbors Nancy and Troy step in to help. Of course, many thanks to all those who work so hard, to give of their time to serve the homeless and hungry of Harrisburg .
